Why Invest in Bicycle and Pedestrian Wayfinding ?

Why Invest in Wayfinding?

- Provide guidance on complicated routes
- "Face" of the active transportation system/branding
- Encourage and promote active transportation
- Inclusion
- Bicycle wayfinding: show that bicycles belong on the street



Why Invest in Wayfinding?

Bicycling Infrastructure: Cost per mile

	Bike Lanes	Paving a Shoulder (Rural)	Shared-Use Path	Signed Bike Route
Minimum	\$35,000	\$30,000	\$170,000	\$2,000
Maximum	\$500,000	\$200,000	\$500,000	\$12,000










What Destinations Should Go on the Signs?



Destination Considerations

Step 1: Identify Key Destinations


- How well known is the destination?
- Is it a destination with many visitors?
- Is it easily reached by bicycle?
- If it is a bike path, does it have a recognizable name?
- Who are you asking?



Destination Considerations

- Well-known landmarks, parks, business districts, major sports venues, major bikeways, schools, libraries
- Private businesses should not be included— use name for area, generic title or symbol
- Can you get to the destination safely? If not, then do not include








Considerations: Logos, Sponsors

- Overlapping Trails or Routes











Considerations: Inclusion and Equity

- Who benefits from the project?
- Languages
- Trail pass requirements








Considerations: Time and/or Distance

- Encouragement tool
- Urban areas with easy access to popular destinations
- For biking, use 10 mph
- For walking, use 3.1 mph





Considerations: Trailheads and Maps

- First step in wayfinding is "orientation"
- Where am I, and where is my destination?
- Don't forget to budget for these!



How to Make it Happen: Implementation

- Train local governments on how to do it (make a manual)
- Require wayfinding in all new projects
- Share resources (for example, Madison sign shop)
- Labor and installation logistics



How to Make it Happen: Funding

- Friends' groups (Janesville Velo Club)
- Health Care Systems (Winnebago County Public Health Department and Ascension Health Care System)
- County Highway/County Parks Departments and Municipal Government
- Snowmobile groups
- Convention and Visitors Bureaus
